I, Chief Scott Young of the Strafford New Hampshire Police Department, being a duly sworn officer of the law herewith make application for the issuance of an Arrest Warrant against the defendant,

Probable cause:

Based on the facts and circumstances found to exist and contained within this affidavit, a reasonably intelligent and prudent person would conclude that a crime or crimes have been committed and that the above named person did commit that/those crimes as indicated.

- 1) On 01/08/16 I responded to a domestic disturbance at 526 First Crown Point, where it was reported that an assault occurred.
- 2) Upon my arrival, I came into contact with two victims, Theresa Madore, the defendants mother, and Jacinta Madore, the defendants sister.
- 3) Theresa said that they got into a physical altercation with her son, the defendant, John Marore. John was angry that they had to put down the family dog.
- 4) During the altercation, Theresa was grabbed around the neck and knocked to the floor and Jacinta was grabbed around the neck and was choked to the point of not being able to breath.
- 5) Officer Durrance of the Barrington Police Dept arrived and we entered the home and found the defendant barricaded in his upstairs bedroom. During conversations, the defendant indicated that "he has firearms and this was not going to end well". After several attempts to end the incident peacefully, Chief Young decided to activate a SWAT Team. While Young was on the phone with the SWAT team leader, the defendant surrendered peacefully.
- 6) The defendant was arrested and transported to the Strafford County Jail.

6) After the defendant was taken into custody, he was transported to the Strafford Police Department where he was booked. He was then transported to the Strafford County Jail.

Based on the foregoing information, there is probable cause to believe that the defendant did commit the crime or offense as stated above.

Wherefore, I request the issuance of an arrest warrant and an order for a duly authorized officer to take the defendant and bring him/her before the court having jurisdiction.
