## Legislation

Two pieces of proposed legislation in this year's legislative session may be of interest to mediators and neutrals.

#### SB 336 - Relative to Family Mediator Interns

This bill would establish the qualifications and appropriate instances of include of qualified family mediator interns in court-referred mediations.

# SB 216 - Establishing a Commission to Study the Landlord and Tenant Mediation Program in Circuit Courts

This bill would establish a commission to study the landlord-tenant mediation program in the Circuit Court and report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to the President of the Senate, Speaker of the House of Representatives, Senate Clerk, House Clerk, the Governor, and the State Library.
