Appointment of Richard Guerriero to Judicial Conduct Committee

Keene Attorney Richard Guerriero has been appointed to the State of New Hampshire Judicial Conduct Committee succeeding Attorney Jaye Rancourt.

Attorney Guerriero has extensive experience in New Hampshire courts. He has been a member of the New Hampshire Bar for 30 years and a practicing attorney for 39 years. He has handled many cases in the New Hampshire Circuit and Superior Courts, as well as the New Hampshire Supreme Court. From 2000 to 2012, Attorney Guerriero was the Litigation Director at the New Hampshire Public Defender. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the New Hampshire Public Defender and is the Chair of the Criminal Justice Act Panel for the United States District Court in Concord.

The New Hampshire Bar Association presented Attorney Guerriero with the Award for Distinguished Service to the Legal Profession in 2024. The New Hampshire Bar Foundation selected Attorney Guerriero for the Frank Rowe Kennison Award in 2009 for contributions to the administration of justice. Attorney Guerriero was made a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers in 2007.

Attorney Guerriero was the President of the New Hampshire Bar for the 2021-2022 term, having previously served as Vice President and President Elect. He also served for many years on the Continuing Legal Education and Ethics Committees. He has chaired the Bar's Annual Ethics CLE for the last 9 years.

Attorney Guerriero has been a trial attorney at the law firm of Lothstein Guerriero, PLLC, since 2013. The firm has offices in Keene and Concord. The firm's practice focuses on criminal trials and appeals, in state and federal courts.
